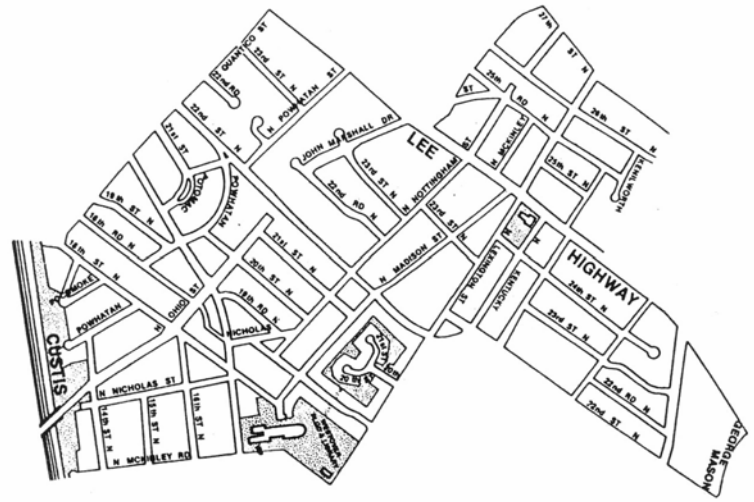

## Community Meeting Offers Last Chance to Comment On Plans for the Lee Center

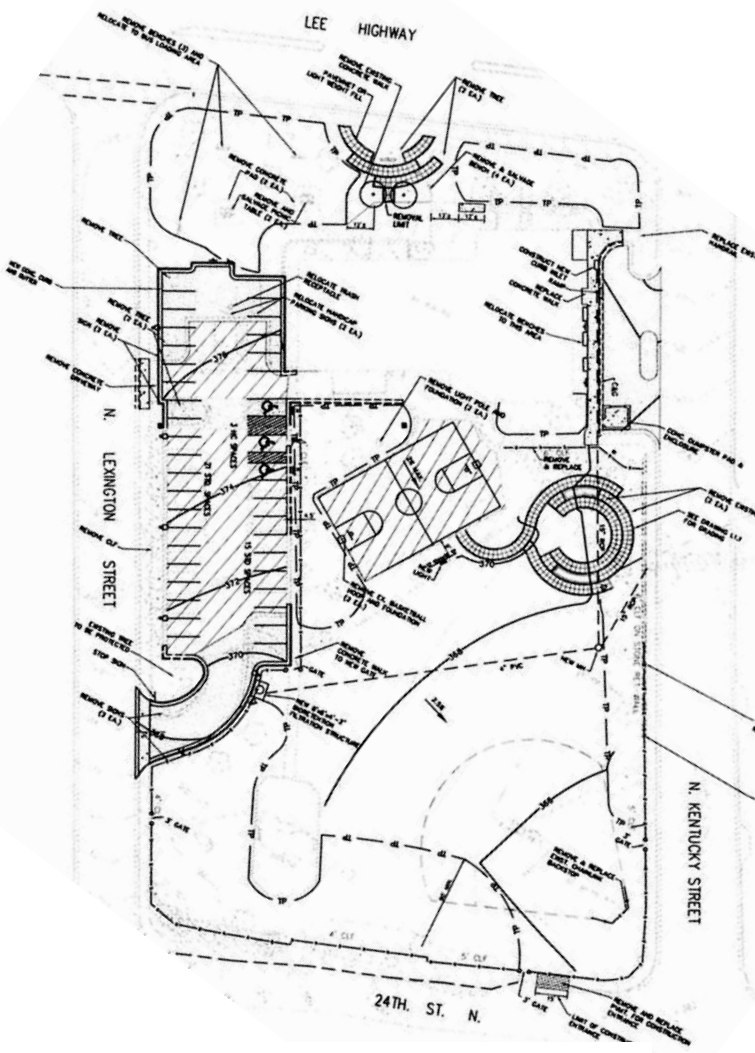
The civic association meeting on Wednesday, September 15 offers the community a final chance to comment on the Lee Center site improvement plan. The plans are now at the 95 percent phase. Information presented will be the same as that at the meeting held on July 26, 2004.

The civic association will provide written comments on the proposal including any suggestions made for improvements to the plan.

Some proposed features of the site plan include:

- ◆ 16 new standard plus 3 handicap parking spaces
- ◆ Parking lot moved further from large oak trees
- ◆ Single entry/exit to the parking area
- ◆ Shrubs at west end of building are saved
- ◆ Wording for main building sign will be determined by Lee Center staff
- ◆ During construction there will be 10 parking spaces available at all times
- ◆ Walkway alongside the parking lot has been reduced
- ◆ Chain link fence directly behind building deleted and shifted further from parking lot.
- ◆ Two picnic benches with concrete pads to be removed
- ◆ Wheelchair curb cut will be placed directly in front of door on east side
- ◆ East side sidewalk island will remain

# Traffic Calming Measures To be Installed on Lexington St.

Measures approved several years ago by a majority of the residents along and near N. Lexington Street to slow speeding traffic will be installed starting this month. These measures include the following:

- raised crosswalks at N. 19<sup>th</sup> Street and N. 22<sup>nd</sup> Street (similar to that by the Westover Library)
- asphalt speed cushions near N. 23<sup>rd</sup> Street (similar to those recently installed on N. 16<sup>th</sup> Street between the hospital and Glebe Road)
- a red brick-patterned crosswalk near N. 24<sup>th</sup> Street
- a red brick-patterned caution area near Lee Highway
- curb nubs at most street intersections north of the Westover Library
- white striping of the parking lanes along N. Lexington Street

These improvements are intended to slow the average speed of vehicles along this well-traveled street in the community. The average speed of too many cars was found to be over 35 mph. The speed limit is 25 mph.
